Pursuant to Title XV, Subtitle A, Section 1511 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (Pub. L. 111-5, Feb. 17, 2009) ("ARRA"), I, Lincoln D. Chafee, hereby certify that the attached infrastructure investments funded with amounts appropriated by ARRA under the heading: "State Fiscal Stabilization Funds" ("SFSF"), have received the full review and vetting required by law and that I accept responsibility that such investments are appropriate uses of taxpayer dollars.

The SFSF program is authorized in Title XIV of Division A of ARRA. The Education Stabilization Fund (CFDA No. 84.394) is for supporting and restoring funding for elementary, secondary, and postsecondary education. This includes assistance for modernization, renovation, or repair of IHE (institute of higher education) facilities.

The State may submit additional certifications to address subsequent infrastructure investments.

I understand that the State of Rhode Island may not receive ARRA infrastructure investment funding unless this certification is made and posted.
