### **Agency Mission**

The mission of this agency is to provide nuclear and radiation science and engineering technical and irradiation services to the public, and regional education, research, industry and government institutions.

### **Agency Description**

The Rhode Island Nuclear Science Center (RINSC) is located at the University of Rhode Island, Bay Campus, in Narragansett. The RINSC operates a 2-MWth research reactor and provides laboratories and classrooms for research and educational programs for the University of Rhode Island (URI) and other colleges and universities in Rhode Island and throughout New England. The RINSC has been operated on a daily basis without incident since 1962 providing medical, biological, environmental, and materials research, offering educational programs and supporting commercial activities benefiting the citizens of Rhode Island. Much of the research and educational activities are funded by grants from federal agencies bringing the benefits of the activities to the state while minimizing the burden on the taxpayers of Rhode Island. In addition, the staff administers the radiation safety program for the University of Rhode Island under an agreement with the University, providing partial financial support for a portion of the RINSC staff.

### **Statutory History**

The Rhode Island Atomic Energy Commission was established in 1958 by R.I. General Laws § 42-27 for the purpose of advising the governor and general assembly on matters relating to atomic energy and to construct and operate a nuclear reactor in the state.
